We believe in **academic integrity**. The Student Honor Code below sets out the principles every PaperDue user agrees to when they create an account and use the Service.

What PaperDue Is — and Is Not — For

PaperDue's model papers are **examples of student writing** intended to teach, demonstrate, and inspire. They are not finished work product to be submitted under your name. Here is the difference at a glance:

YOU AGREE NOT TO

Submit any paper or portion of a paper from PaperDue as your own original work

Plagiarize content, in whole or in part, from any paper, writing guide, or other content on the Service

Violate the academic integrity policy, honor code, or rules of your school, college, or university

Misrepresent the authorship of any paper to any instructor, professor, administrator, or examining body

Resell, redistribute, or republish any content from the Service

Use the Service in any way that constitutes academic dishonesty, cheating, contract cheating, or fraud

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How to Use PaperDue Ethically

Here is how to get real value out of the Service while maintaining your academic integrity:

1

READ AND LEARN

Read sample papers the way you would read a published article — to see how the writer structured the argument, supported claims with evidence, and handled counterarguments.

CITE WHAT YOU USE

If a sample paper points you toward a source you end up using, cite that source directly in your own paper. If you quote or paraphrase any language from a PaperDue paper itself, **cite PaperDue as the source**.

3

WRITE YOUR OWN WORDS

Your paper should be written by you, in your own voice, reflecting your own analysis. Use PaperDue papers as **models, not as templates to copy**.

4

CHECK YOUR INSTITUTION'S POLICY

Every school has its own academic integrity policy. You are responsible for knowing what your institution allows and prohibits. **When in doubt, ask your instructor.**

USE OUR TOOLS TO IMPROVE YOUR OWN DRAFTS

Outline generators, citation tools, and writing guides are designed to support your own writing process, not to replace it.

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Running Your Work Through Plagiarism Checkers

PaperDue model papers are written by human contributors and have, in some cases, been published online for a long period. They may be indexed by plagiarism detection services such as **Turnitin, SafeAssign**, and similar tools.

THEY WILL FLAG A COPIED PAPER

If you submit any portion of a PaperDue paper as your own work, those services are **likely to flag it**. We strongly encourage you to run your own final draft through a plagiarism checker before submission to confirm that your work is original.

Your Responsibility

You are **solely responsible** for how you use the Service and the content you find on it. Electronic Inspiration LLC and PaperDue are not responsible for any academic, disciplinary, professional, or legal consequences that result from a user violating their institution's policies, this Honor Code, or our [Terms of Service](#).
